An EMR provides immediate life saving care to critical patients. It is the minimal level required to drive an ambulance and takes about 40 hours of training.



2

The EMT is the minimal level of training to provide medical care during the transport of a patient. An EMT course takes about 150-190 hours to complete.

Paramedics have the highest level of training among these roles. The paramedic provides advanced emergency medical care to critically ill patients. Paramedicine is a 2-year associates degree and certification.
